# **PRACTICE**



There were **2,333** patient encounters at the **Pharmacists Clinic from July 2020–June 2021**; the **cumulative total** throughout its **92 months** of operation is **19,342**.

In October 2020 the **Pharmacists in Primary Care Network (PCN) Program began** and in January 2021 the **first Primary Care Clinical Pharmacist started** in the Kootenay Boundary PCN.

In January 2021 the **first pharmacy gained access to CareConnect** for better patient drug therapy monitoring.

In March 2021 a **three-year contract extension** was provided to **support the health and wellbeing of First Nations people**.
